



## 11am Updated PRESS RELEASE - Worthing High School - GCSE Results 2016

### **Celebrating another increase in results!**

Worthing High is delighted to announce a further improvement in results this year. Our students have made incredible progress across the board confirmed by the new national progress performance measure (Progress 8). Our strong EBACC result reinforces our belief that students at Worthing High School should have access to a broad and balanced curriculum which includes studying a Modern Foreign Language and Geography or History.

- 62 % of our students achieved GCSE's in both English and Maths.
- Our Progress 8 figure is 0.42 which means that our students achieved almost half a grade better than expected for their ability.
- Our Ebacc figure rose by 9 % to 45% (national average 2015- 24%). This is the percentage of students who gained a grade A\*-C in English, Maths, Science, a Modern Foreign Language and either History or Geography.

Carolyn Dickinson Headteacher said "We are celebrating excellent results achieved by all our students. Our results have increased again this year through the hard work of both students and staff. Subjects which have performed particularly well include:

Biology - 100% A\*-C  
Further Mathematics -100% A\*-C  
French - 99% A\*-C  
Physics - 96% A\*-C  
Chemistry - 96% A\*-C  
German - 94% A\*-C  
Digital ICT – 92% A\*-C  
Statistics – 87% A\*-C  
History 84% A\*-C  
Music - 83% A\*-C
